



# Emergency Food Assistance Program

## What is the Emergency Food Assistance Program (EFAP)?

The Emergency Food Assistance Program (EFAP) is a USDA program which works to improve the health of low-income families by supplementing their diets with nutritious foods. The Food Bank receives food from the USDA and distributes food packages at more than 80 locations throughout San Diego County. Food packages contain a variety of canned foods, dry grains, proteins (plant-based, canned or frozen meat), and other nutritious items.

## How to get EFAP food:

To be eligible, participants must be a resident of San Diego County and meet the federal income guidelines\* listed below. Eligible applicants may call 2-1-1 or call the Food Bank for the location of their nearest distribution site. No documentation is required.
