## Food Bank Distributes Turkeys and Groceries to Families for the Holidays

On a chilly November evening in City Heights, hundreds of low-income families, many with young children, received frozen turkeys and food packages ahead of Thanksgiving at a Food Bank food distribution.

Soledad arrived at 1 p.m. to get in line early for a frozen turkey and food for the distribution that started at 5 p.m. She came to the food distribution with her children (pictured above left). "My husband and I both have jobs, but we are struggling to feed our children. Rent, gas, electricity, and food have all gone up so much. The Food Bank is really helping us right now," said Soledad.

"My husband, Saul, and I have four children. Jocelyn is a year old. Jonathan is three years old and in preschool at Head Start. Stephanie is seven years old and in the first grade, and Saul Jr. is sixteen years old and in tenth grade," she continues.

"My husband works as a cook in a restaurant eight to ten hours a day, six days a week, and I work in a restaurant three days a week. We take turns taking care of the kids. When he's not working, he watches them, and I watch them when he's working."

Soledad and her husband applied for CalFresh (Food Stamps), but they do not qualify for the federal program because their combined income is slightly over the limit of 200% of the Federal Poverty Level. "Without the food we get from the Food Bank every month, we would have to buy cheaper foods and make smaller portions to make the food stretch," says Soledad.


As we begin this New Year, our staff and Board of Directors remain focused on providing nutritious food and resources to the more than 400,000 individuals who need our help each month.


"We are getting help from the Food Bank once a month at the food distribution in Clairemont, and we came here today to get a frozen turkey and food for Thanksgiving. If we didn't get help from the Food Bank, we wouldn't have a Thanksgiving this year," explains Soledad.

Larell and her son, Cartier, (pictured top right on page 1) who live in Mira Mesa, also attended the distribution to receive a frozen turkey and groceries for Thanksgiving.

"I am a single mom of three, and I have a granddaughter. I work full time as a nurse, but I am currently on disability leave after a major operation. I will be out for a month, and my last paycheck was last month. I am worried that I won't get my disability check since it's taking too long to process. I support all of my family, and this year without the Food Bank, we wouldn't have had a turkey because we couldn't afford it."

"My son, Cartier, is nine years old and in the fourth grade. My daughter, Daryl, is in college, and my son, Tyeshay, works as a driver. He has daughter Amara who is 8 years old," says Larell.

"Most people think that nurses get paid a lot, but that's not the case at all. I have not had a pay raise this year, and I am supporting our entire family. Our gas and electricity bills have gone through the roof, and the price of food is outrageous, so I am buying cheap, frozen, processed foods now because it's cheaper. Meat and produce are too expensive. We also go to the Food Bank's food distribution in Poway to get help with food."



Thanks to the Food Bank's donors, Soledad and Larell's families received a frozen turkey and groceries ahead of Thanksgiving, and they are able to visit our emergency food pantries when they need help with food. 
