The Food Bank Helps Families and Seniors Facing Food Insecurity

On a cold and rainy day in late November, Nancy (pictured above left) and Cynthia, with her son Xavier (pictured above right), visited the Food Bank's Client Choice Food Pantry for food assistance. Nancy, a retired nurse, and her husband, Richard, are both disabled and living on social security. Cynthia is a stay-at-home mom with four children, and her family is struggling to get by on her husband's paycheck.

"I have been coming to the Food Bank for about eight months now, and it's a total blessing. I am a retired nurse. My husband and I are disabled, and we are living in an apartment community for seniors. Our rent has increased around 10% every year. You think they keep one rate when you move in, and it keeps going up, and we have been in shock about the whole thing. This has become part of our life now," explains Nancy.

"This past year, the price of everything went up about 25%. The only way we can keep food on the table is to come here to the Food Bank, and we have been rejoicing at the quality of the food. I think it's far better than what you can get at the market."

"The Food Bank was giving away turkeys for Thanksgiving, and we were so grateful because it was a wonderful turkey. Without the Food Bank, we wouldn't have had a turkey for the holiday because turkeys were so expensive," she continues.

Cynthia also visited the food pantry to get food assistance. "There are six of us in our family. I am staying at home to look after the kids. My son Xavier is one-and-a-half years old. My son Gino is ten years old and in the fifth grade. My daughter Giselle is seven years old and in the second grade, and my daughter Genesis is five years old and in pre-kindergarten," says Cynthia.

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"My husband is working in maintenance for apartments, and we use his paycheck to pay for the car and the rent and for gas, but we just don't have the income to afford everything on his paycheck. We only have one car, so I take him to work, and I use the car during the day. I was working before as a pre-school teacher, but I am staying home because my son is autistic, and specialized childcare for an autistic child is much more expensive," explains Cynthia.

"I couldn't work right now because sometimes I need to go to the school two or three times a week because something happened to him, and it would be hard for me to find a job where it's ok for me to leave every time there is a situation at school. For example, today I have an intervention meeting for my son this afternoon at school," she continues.

"Our rent has gone up by \$500 over the last couple of years, and the cost of food has gone up, and gas has gone up. Bread, milk and eggs have all gone up. And with three kids the milk goes really fast. The Food Bank helps so much. The food that I get here helps me save that money, and I can use that to buy meat, medicine, gas and pay the extra rent that we have to pay now."

At the food pantry, Cynthia receives a range of nutritious foods including a loaf of bread, frozen meats, canned vegetables, oatmeal, tortillas, milk, fresh produce, canned tomatoes, canned beans, canned fruits, a bag of pecans, spaghetti sauce, dry pasta, canned tomatoes and diapers for her youngest son.

As Nancy loads the food into her car, she smiles and says, "The Food Bank is Nancy loads food from the Food Bank into her car for her and her husband.

Volunteers Needed at Senior Food Distributions

Calling all volunteers! The San Diego Food Bank needs volunteers to assist at our Senior Food Program distribution sites located throughout San Diego County.

The Food Bank's Senior Food Program serves more than 15,000 seniors facing food insecurity who are living at or near the poverty line. Seniors enrolled in the program receive a monthly 40-pound box of food filled with a variety of food items including shelf-stable milk, cereal, peanut butter, canned meats, canned fruits, canned vegetables, pasta, juice and other nutritious food items.

Pandemic-Inspired Giving Turns into a Monthly Commitment

It wasn't until the COVID-19 pandemic that Charlie, a longtime resident of Clairemont, realized how prevalent food insecurity was in San Diego County — and how quickly a family's circumstances could change.

Ongoing media coverage in the early weeks of the shutdown showing scenes of San Diegans waiting in line for food assistance surprised and inspired Charlie to get involved and "do his part."

"People who were used to giving were now on the receiving end," he recalled. "The government sent out assistance checks, and I didn't need mine — I was doing ok. I wanted the money to go to people who were in need, so I gave that money to the Food Bank. I trusted the Food Bank to use my money efficiently and get food to the people who needed it."

As time went on, Charlie realized the issue of food insecurity was an ongoing problem, not just a COVID-related issue. As a veteran, he was also shocked to see

how many low-income military families relied on the Food Bank. "It doesn't make sense to me — you're in the military but you can't feed your family."

And so Charlie became a monthly donor by providing ongoing funds the Food Bank can count on. For Charlie, giving every month fits his budget rather than making one larger gift. And it is an easy way to support his neighbors in need. "I'd feel guilty if I didn't give. As a society, I think we need to take care of those


